TAMPA – Sun Sports will produce and televise all games featuring the Tampa Bay Lightning vs. the Ottawa Senators in the 2006 NHL Eastern Conference Quarterfinals (in the Lightning's television territory only – Northern and Central Florida). *Specifics on Sun Sports' coverage for the if necessary Games #5-7 will be announced at a later date.*

Sun Sports' Tampa Bay Lightning telecast team of **Rick Peckham** (play-by-play), **Bobby "The Chief" Taylor** (analyst) and **Paul Kennedy** (host) call the action live from the St. Pete Times Forum and Scotiabank Place in Ontario.

All telecasts, both home and away, will include the half-hour "Lightning Ice Time" pregame show, hosted by Kennedy, and live post-game coverage from site. For all home playoff games televised on Sun Sports, the network will set-up outside the St. Pete Times Forum, enabling fans to watch on-site, and Kennedy will be joined by former Lightning center **Brian Bradley**.
